Key Scripture: “For God is not the author of confusion, but of peace, as in all churches of the saints” (1 Cor 14:33)

Key Thought: The author of confusion is an enemy of your soul.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, I thank you for the fact that you are not the author of confusion in my life¹, and because of you I never have to be confused. I praise you for not giving me a spirit of fear; instead, you have given me a spirit of power, love, and a sound mind.² Thank you, Lord.

You have invited me to cast my burdens upon you, Lord; therefore, I cast my burden of confusion upon you, realizing that you will sustain me. I thank you, Father, for always sustaining me. I know you will never permit me to be swayed from the peace I have in you.⁶

Thank you for your peace which surpasses all understanding. It has taken away confusion I was experiencing and I know your peace will keep my heart and mind through Christ Jesus.⁷

Thank you for setting me free from confusion, Father.
