Prepare _____'s mind for action. Let her be self-controlled, with her hope set fully on the grace to be given him/her when Jesus Christ is revealed. (1 Peter 1:13)

Let _____ be diligent, O Lord, and satisfy all his desires. (Proverbs 13:4)
