THEME: The Year of the Open Door
Isaiah 22:22; Revelation 3:8



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The 2024 WOOMC Consecration and Fasting Month

²In those days I Daniel was mourning three full weeks. ³I ate no pleasant bread, neither came flesh nor wine in my mouth, neither did I anoint myself at all, till three whole weeks were fulfilled (Daniel 10:2-3, Amplified).

Our annual congregational 21-day Daniel Fast will begin on Monday, January 8, 2024. Throughout Scripture, God always requires the first of everything in our lives, including our talents, finances, and time. Therefore, the first month of the year belongs to Him.

Start Date: Monday, January 8, 2024

End Date: Sunday, January 28, 2024

Choose one of the following fasting plans.

FASTING PLAN 1: Do 21 days of the Daniel Fast (see pages 4-8 for the complete Daniel Fast list and guidelines).

FASTING PLAN 2:

Week	Dates	Type of Fast
First Week	January 8-14, 2024	Partial fast (one meal per day)
Second Week	January 15-21, 2024	Partial fast (fruits and vegetables only)
Third Week	January 22-28, 2024	Total fast (only liquids)

Note: *Those with health conditions such as diabetes who need to eat should eat something or stay on the fruit and vegetable schedule. Please be led by the Spirit to determine what works best for you if you have a medical condition.*

CHURCH SCHEDULE CONSECRATION

We will focus on praying the open-door prayer points in this packet and praying in the Spirit in tongues during this fast. Every member should fulfill one hour, one day of prayer during the three (3) weeks of fasting by coming to church. Many people do not have adequate time to pray and consecrate themselves during the consecration month because of the many distractions in our homes. The one hour at church should be focused on praying in the Spirit, praying the open-door prayer points, and doing spiritual warfare for the church. Everyone should give the Lord at least one hour or more of prayer time daily for their family needs at home, except when we come to the church. We will also have prayer on Sunday, January 28, 2024, at 6 pm in the sanctuary.

YOUR PERSONAL SPIRITUAL NEEDS FOR 2024

We ask you to pray for the following matters each day during the fast:

- I. Pray to God for His glory to descend upon WOOMC and you individually (*2 Chronicles 5:13-14; 2 Chronicles 7:1*).
- II. Pray for God to baptize you with His Spirit and fire. Ask that His Spirit and fire descend upon you (*Luke 3:16; Malachi 3:2*).
- III. Cry out to God for more hunger and thirst for Him (*Matthew 5:6*).
- IV. Pray to God for souls to come into His kingdom and that He would use you to help reap the harvest (*Isaiah 43:5-6; 2 Corinthians 5:18-19*).
- V. Pray for God to challenge us individually and corporately to sacrifice for Him and His Church in the following areas in 2024:
 - A. Holiness (*Romans 12:1; Psalm 84:11*)
 - B. Time, Serving, Being Equipped or Being Used for Ministry (*Ephesians 4:11-12*)
 - C. Prayer and Fasting (*2 Chronicles 26:5; Jeremiah 29:13*)
 - D. Giving (*2 Corinthians 9:6-8*)
 - E. Praise and Worship (*Hebrews 13:15; Psalm 8:2*)

F. Or any other area where you must make sacrifices unto the Lord. Ask God to show and expose the areas where you need to yield to Him (*2 Samuel 24:24-25*).

VI. Sit quietly before the Lord to hear His voice (*Psalms 34:10; 2 Chronicles 26:5; Jeremiah 29:13*).

How to Fast

Fasting and Prayer: Getting a Breakthrough When You Need It

I. WHAT IS FASTING?

It is the voluntary and deliberate abstinence from food for concentrated prayer.

II. WHY DO MOST CHRISTIANS NO LONGER FAST?

Hosea 4:6 says, *“My people are destroyed for a lack of knowledge.”* Many Christians have abandoned the custom of prayer and fasting for all so far, but many have not been taught especially new converts. Older Christians know about prayer and fasting because it was more commonly taught and practiced years ago. Today, it is a neglected doctrine of the church.

III. WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF PRAYER AND FASTING?

Read **Isaiah 58:5-9**.

A. The Need to Crucify the Flesh

Read **Hebrews 12:11**. If we can get your flesh out of the way, we will have greater clarity and greater sensitivity in the spirit about what to ask for and receive answers. We don't know what to pray for when the flesh dominates us.

Read **Romans 8:6**. One of the worst aspects of the flesh is pride. Pride will take us straight into the arms of Satan. Fasting destroys pride, something with which we all struggle. Fasting produces HUMILITY.

B. The Need to Hear the Voice of God

Read **Acts 13:2-3**. Prayer and fasting give directions. It makes us sensitive to God's voice. It enables us to hear His voice above the other voices around us. What could be more important? See **Acts 13:1-3, 14:21-23, Matthew 7:7, Matthew. 6:33**.

C. The Need for Power

Read **Luke 4:14**. It causes more power. The Church of the Lord Jesus Christ is being called back to the basics to apply itself and the power of God that enables us to stand against the enemy. See **Luke 4:1-2; Matthew 14:14, 15:32, 20: 34**.

D. The Need for More Faith

There can be no results when the Word of God is not combined with faith. God's blessings are not automatic (**Romans 1:17; Matthew 21:22**). The story of Hannah offers a biblical example of faith mixed with prayer and fasting (**I Samuel 1:5-20**).

E. The Need for Preparation

Read **Matthew 7:24-27**. To prepare means the process of making something ready beforehand for use. Preparation means getting something ready for a project. We want to be blessed but don't want to do what is necessary to receive the blessing. So, we serve God when we feel like it or need Him. When we are unprepared, our lives are in danger. Let's prepare.

F. The Need for a Healthy Lifestyle

Read **Isaiah 58:8**. It disciplines our spirit and physical body. While we bring the flesh into subjection to the Spirit of God and develop a deeper relationship with our heavenly Father, we get the “side benefit” of a more healthy body. When we fast, our system is cleansed from toxins. Uncontrolled eating gradually damages the body. Periods of fasting bring the body into balance and help regulate the systems so things run more smoothly. Remember, if we are not eating and not praying, we are just on a diet. It is so important to fast *and* pray.

IV. DIFFERENT TYPES OF FASTS:

- A. **Twenty-four-hour fast:** This fast lasts from sunset to sunset. Abstain from solids.
- B. **Partial fast:** Abstain from pleasant foods. Partake only of clear soup, fruit juice, cereals, or grain, or give up one meal a day for prayer. (See **Daniel 1:8-16; 10: 2,3.**)
- C. **Three-day fast:** Total abstinence of food for three days (See **Esther 4:16**).
- D. **Extended fast:** There are two methods: both require preparation. Before an extended fast, it is recommended that you omit caffeine and rich foods from your diet.
- E. **Total fast:** Excludes all food but does include water. The fast should be broken slowly. Only diluted juices for a day or two. Next, gradually proceed to fruit, vegetables, and grains, adding meat last.
- F. **Non-total fast:** No food intake. Only diluted fruit juices, water, and hot herbal teas are taken.

Remember, fasting is more than just abstaining from food; it is an act of self-denial for higher purposes. Therefore, it is essential to **CHECK YOUR MOTIVES** and **HEART** attitudes with the Lord before you determine to fast. Read **Matthew 6:16-18**.

NOTE: *If you are on medication, consult your physician before commencing an extended fast. You may need to consider a partial fast. Fast when directed by the Holy Spirit and maintain your disciplined prayer life* (Isaiah 58:6, I Corinthians 9:26-27).

V. HOW TO PRAY & FAST MORE EFFECTIVELY

A. Make a Personal Commitment to Prayer and Fasting.

The first step to successful prayer and fasting is to make a **COMMITMENT** to do it.

That commitment is finalized by making a proclamation and expressing your intentions.

If you are not committed to fasting, any excuse will be made to avoid it. Read **James 1:6-8**.

B. Prepare Yourself for Prayer and Fasting.

I Corinthians 9:27 – You must prepare mentally, physically, emotionally, and spiritually for a fast. Tell your body what to expect. Say this confession: ***I will bring my spirit, body, emotions, and mind all under subjection to God's Word by giving myself to prayer and fasting.***

C. Stop Making Excuses.

Read **Luke 14:18**: ***“And they all with one consent began to make excuse.”*** You may say, ***“I’m too busy!” “I’m too old!” “I’m too young!”*** Read the example of an older woman in **Luke 2:36-38**.

Fasting and Prayer Guidelines

1. The church will enter into 21 days of fasting and prayer schedule beginning Monday, January 8, 2024, and ending Sunday, January 28, 2024.
2. This year, the focus of our fast will be meditating on God's Word, praying in the Spirit in tongues, and praying the points in this packet during this fast. OPTIONAL: Read the book of Psalms.
3. We seek God to hear from Him and to know Him more intimately. As we seek after Him, He will speak to us about the issues that could be blocking the blessings in our lives.
4. Fasting is more than just not eating food. Fasting is putting the flesh under so that you can hear from God. Therefore, if we are not eating but are always on the computer or watching TV, then we are not concentrating on the Lord. Do only the necessary things for your home or family: home, chores, feeding children, work, etc. Give God some time alone with Him, at least an hour or more.
5. Prayer and fasting do not always mean we do all the talking. Prayer does not always mean we are positioned on our knees with hands folded praying. We can sit and read the Word, read the open-door prayer points in this packet, read a spiritual book, or just be quiet and listen to the Lord. Listening to a ministry tape is also very good. Sometimes, praising and worshipping the Lord in the Holy Ghost by praying in tongues is sufficient.
6. Everyone is on a different spiritual level; therefore, individual fasting needs will differ. Some people will be able to fast with no food and drink water only. Everyone is not on the same faith level to do this. Some will do a partial or Daniel fast throughout, whereby foods such as salads, fruits, cereals, and grains are consumed (*Daniel 10:2-3*). See the ***Daniel Fast Food List*** on pages 7-8.
7. Some fasts are mentioned in scripture that last from sunset to sunset (24 hours) or for half a day (12 hours). Other fasts involved missing a meal you enjoy and using the time to pray and seek God (*2 Chronicles 20:3*). Those who have a desperate need may have to consecrate themselves more intensely. Be led by the Holy Spirit as to how you will fast.
8. For those ***not*** used to fasting, I suggest you learn to become victorious with shorter fasting periods, such as an every-other-day fast, a half-day fast, or a main meal fast (miss a major meal). You may choose to fast only three days out of the week (ex: M-W-F) when the church is fasting. Once again, those who need more from God and are mature enough to go deeper should fast daily.
9. If you should yield to eating during the fast when you should not have, or if you turned on the TV, DVD, or computer, repent to the Lord, do not get into condemnation, and start over again. God will honor that. You may take an eight-hour period where you do not eat, then pray for an hour or more. Once you have done that, you can check phones and e-mails and watch something inspiring.
10. You are permitted to play worship music during your time of prayer and fasting if you like.
11. We must not base our fasting results on what we see during or immediately after the fast. We may not see the manifestation of what we believe God for until days, weeks, or even months later.

Daniel Fast Food List

In those days I Daniel was mourning three full weeks. I ate no pleasant bread, neither came flesh nor wine in my mouth, neither did I anoint myself at all, till three whole weeks were fulfilled (Daniel 10:2-3).

One of the great things about the Daniel Fast is that you are not limited to any specific amount of food but rather to the kinds of foods you can eat. The Daniel Fast is limited to fruits, vegetables, and water. Please **READ THE LABEL** when purchasing packaged, canned, or bottled foods. They should be **sugar-free** and **chemical-free**. Keep this in mind as you review this list of acceptable foods.

Foods to Eat During the Daniel Fast

All fruits: These can be fresh, frozen, dried, or canned. Fruits include but are not limited to **apples, apricots, bananas, blackberries, blueberries, boysenberries, cantaloupe, cherries, cranberries, figs, grapefruit, grapes, guava, honeydew melon, kiwi, lemons, mangoes, nectarines, oranges, papayas, peaches, pears, pineapples, plums, prunes, raisins, raspberries, strawberries, tangelos, tangerines, watermelon.**

All vegetables: These can be fresh, frozen, dried, or canned. Vegetables include but are not limited to **artichokes, asparagus, beets, broccoli, Brussel sprouts, cabbage, carrots, cauliflower, celery, chili peppers, collard greens, corn, cucumbers, eggplant, garlic, ginger root, kale, leeks, lettuce, mushrooms, mustard greens, okra, onions, parsley, potatoes, radishes, rutabagas, scallions, spinach, sprouts, squashes, sweet potatoes, tomatoes, turnips, watercress, yams, zucchini, veggie burgers** are an option if you are not allergic to soy.

All whole grains: including, but not limited to, **whole wheat, brown rice, millet, quinoa, oats, barley, grits, whole wheat pasta, whole wheat tortillas, rice cakes, and popcorn.**

All nuts and seeds, including, but not limited to, **sunflower seeds, cashews, peanuts, and sesame.** Also, **nut butter, including peanut butter.**

All legumes: These can be either canned or dried. Legumes include, but are not limited to, **dried beans, pinto beans, split peas, lentils, black-eyed peas, kidney beans, black beans, cannellini beans, and white beans.**

All quality oils, including, but not limited to, **olive, canola, grape seed, peanut, and sesame.**

Beverages: **spring water, distilled water, 100% all-natural fruit juices, 100% all-natural vegetable juices.** You may drink protein drinks and smoothies if they are **sugar-free, dairy-free, and chemical-free.**

Other: **tofu, olives, vinegar, seasonings, salt, herbs and spices.** Soy and rice milk are acceptable for cooking and with cereal. However, they should not be used as a beverage since the Daniel Fast is a “water-only” beverage fast with the exception of 100% fruit or vegetable juice, which is merely pulp with water.

Foods to Avoid During the Daniel Fast

All meat and animal products, including, but not limited to, **beef, lamb, pork, poultry, and fish.**

All dairy products, including, but not limited to, **milk, cheese, cream, butter, and eggs.**

All sweeteners: including **sugar, raw sugar, honey, syrups, molasses, and cane juice.**

All leavened bread, including **Ezekiel Bread** (it contains yeast and honey) and baked goods.

All refined and processed food products, including, but not limited to, artificial flavorings, food additives, chemicals, white rice, white flour, and foods that contain artificial preservatives.

All deep-fried foods, including, but not limited to, potato chips, French fries, and **corn chips**.

All solid fats, including **shortening, margarine, lard, and foods high in fat**.

Beverages: including, but not limited to, **coffee, tea, herbal teas, carbonated beverages, energy drinks, and alcohol**. Please remember that the Daniel Fast is a “water only” beverage fast. The exception is 100% juice since it is merely pulp with water.

Remember, READ THE LABELS!

2024: Year of the Open Door

Below is a list of prayer and fasting points featured on the ElijahList website by Prophet Charlie Shamp of Moravian Falls, North Carolina. He felt profoundly touched by the Lord to gather 58 prayer points for us, our families, and our church communities to use as we join fellow members of the worldwide Body of Christ in this fasting period. Apostle Williams added the last two points to address the WOOMC Apostolic Center. These prayer and fasting points reflect the essence of the Lord's fast outlined in Isaiah 58. We share them with you to enrich your prayer and fasting time.

- 1. Revival and Outpouring:** "Heavenly Father, we humbly come before You, seeking a mighty revival and outpouring of Your Holy Spirit upon our lives, churches, and communities. We long to experience a fresh move of Your Spirit, awakening hearts and transforming lives" (*Joel 2:28; Acts 2:17*).
- 2. Family and Marriage:** "Lord, we lift up our families and marriages to You. Strengthen the bonds between spouses, parents, and children. May our homes be filled with love, unity, and Your divine presence. Grant us wisdom, patience, and grace to navigate challenges and build strong, godly relationships" (*Ephesians 5:22-33; Colossians 3:18-21*).
- 3. Deliverance and Miracles:** "Dear God, we pray for deliverance from all bondage, addiction, and oppression. Manifest Your miraculous power in our lives, freeing us from chains that bind us. We believe in Your power to perform signs and wonders, bringing supernatural breakthroughs and transformation" (*Psalms 34:17; Luke 4:18*).
- 4. Glory of God and Peace:** "Lord, we desire to witness Your glory manifested in our lives and communities. Let Your presence fill us, bringing peace, joy, and hope. May Your glory be a radiant light that draws others to You and reflects Your love and goodness to the world" (*Isaiah 60:1-2; John 14:27*).
- 5. Government and Nations:** "Heavenly Father, we intercede for our government leaders and nations. Grant them wisdom, integrity, and a heart for justice. May Your Kingdom come, and Your will be done in the governing systems of the world. Raise up righteous leaders who will govern with compassion and righteousness" (*1 Timothy 2:1-2; Proverbs 29:2*).
- 6. Soul Winning and Signs and Wonders:** "Lord, empower us to be bold witnesses of Your Gospel. Open doors for effective evangelism and grant us a heart for the lost. Manifest Your signs and wonders through us, confirming Your Word and drawing people to salvation. Let miracles and divine encounters accompany our efforts" (*Mark 16:15-20; Acts 1:8*).
- 7. Angelic Visitation, Visions, and Dreams:** "Dear God, we ask for angelic visitations, visions, and dreams that align with Your will. Send Your heavenly messengers to minister to us and guide us. Open our spiritual eyes to see and understand the heavenly realm. Speak to us through dreams and visions, revealing Your plans and purposes" (*Acts 2:17; Hebrews 1:14*).
- 8. New Dimensions, Blessings, and Financial Prosperity:** "Lord, we pray for new dimensions in our spiritual walk, relationships, and endeavors. Lead us into greater faith, obedience, and intimacy with You. Pour out Your blessings upon us, including financial prosperity, so that we can bless others and advance Your Kingdom" (*Isaiah 43:18-19; Malachi 3:10*).
- 9. Reconciliation of Relationships and Faith:** "Heavenly Father, heal and restore broken relationships. Please give us the strength and humility to forgive and seek reconciliation. Increase our faith to believe for miracles of restoration and unity. Help us to love one another as You have loved us" (*Matthew 18:21-22; Ephesians 4:32*).

- 10. Dead Raised and Miraculous Healings:** "Dear Lord, we believe in Your power to raise the dead and heal the sick. We pray for miraculous healing in our bodies, minds, and spirits. Extend Your healing touch to those suffering physically, emotionally, or mentally. Let Your resurrection power bring life and wholeness" (*Matthew 10:8; John 11:25*).
- 11. Wisdom and Discernment:** "Gracious God, we seek Your wisdom and discernment in every decision. Grant us clarity of mind and understanding of Your ways. Help us to discern between good and evil and to walk in Your truth. Fill us with the knowledge of Your will and guide our steps" (*James 1:5; Proverbs 3:5-6*).
- 12. Restoration and Renewal:** "Heavenly Father, we pray for restoration and renewal in every area of our lives. Restore what has been lost or broken: relationships, health, finances, and dreams. Renew our spirits and give us the strength to persevere through difficult times. May Your healing touch bring wholeness and new life to us, Lord. Help us to trust in Your promises of restoration and hold on to the hope that You will make all things new" (*Joel 2:25; Psalm 51:10*).
- 13. Protection and Safety:** "Gracious God, we come to You for protection and safety in a world filled with dangers and uncertainties. Shield us from harm and keep us safe from all evil. Surround us with Your angels, and let Your presence be a fortress around us. Guard our hearts, minds, and bodies from any harm, both seen and unseen. Help us to trust in Your perfect protection and find comfort in Your unfailing love" (*Psalm 121:7-8; Proverbs 18:10*).
- 14. Guidance and Direction:** "Heavenly Father, we seek Your guidance and direction in every aspect of our lives. Lead us on the path that You have set before us. Illuminate our minds with Your truth and wisdom. Help us to discern Your voice amidst all the noise and distractions of the world. May we always follow Your ways and walk in obedience to Your commands. Guide us, Lord, and let Your will be done in our lives" (*Psalm 32:8; Proverbs 3:6*).
- 15. Peace and Comfort:** "Loving God, we pray for Your peace and comfort to surround us in times of trouble and distress. Calm our anxious hearts and bring tranquility to our minds. Help us to find rest in Your presence and trust in Your promises. Fill us with Your peace that surpasses all understanding so that we may experience true serenity amidst the storms of life. May Your comforting presence be our refuge and strength" (*Philippians 4:7; Psalm 23:4*).
- 16. Gratitude and Thanksgiving:** "Gracious Father, we come before You with hearts full of gratitude and thanksgiving. Thank You for Your countless blessings and provisions in our lives. Please help us to cultivate a spirit of gratitude and to give thanks in all circumstances. Teach us to appreciate the little things and be thankful even amid challenges. May our lives be a testament to Your goodness and faithfulness" (*1 Thessalonians 5:18; Psalm 107:1*).
- 17. Acceleration:** "Lord, I pray for a supernatural acceleration in every area of my life. Renew my strength and give me the ability to soar above challenges. Let me run with endurance and not grow weary. Help me to walk in Your divine timing and not faint in the face of obstacles" (*Isaiah 40:31*).
- 18. Provision:** "Heavenly Father, I thank You for Your promise to provide for all my needs. I trust in Your abundant riches and ask for financial provision, provision of resources, and provision of opportunities. Open doors of provision unexpectedly and bless the work of my hands" (*Philippians 4:19*).
- 19. Glory Presence:** "Lord, I invite Your glorious presence to fill every aspect of my life. Let Your light shine upon me and guide my steps. Manifest Your glory in my relationships, career, and ministry. May Your presence bring transformation, favor, and breakthroughs in every area" (*Isaiah 60:1*).

- 20. Faith:** "Heavenly Father, I pray for an increase in faith. Help me to trust You more and to hold onto Your promises. Strengthen my faith to believe for the impossible and to step out boldly in obedience to Your leading. Remove all doubt and fear, and fill me with unwavering faith in Your power and faithfulness" (*Hebrews 11:1*).
- 21. New Levels of Signs and Wonders:** "Lord Jesus, I thank You for the signs and wonders You performed during Your ministry. I pray for an anointing to walk in the same power and authority. Take me to new levels of signs and wonders, that Your name may be glorified. Use me as a vessel to bring healing, deliverance, and miracles to those around me" (*John 14:12*).
- 22. Healing and Restoration:** "Loving God, we bring before You those suffering from physical, emotional, or spiritual ailments. We ask for Your healing touch to be upon them. Restore their health and bring them comfort in their pain. Grant them strength and endurance during their journey towards healing. May Your healing power flow through them, restoring every area of their lives" (*Psalms 103:2-3; James 5:14-15*).
- 23. Protection and Safety:** "Gracious Father, we pray for Your protection and safety for ourselves, our loved ones, and all those who are vulnerable. Shield us from harm and keep us safe from all dangers. Guard our minds and hearts from the attacks of the enemy. Surround us with Your angels, that no evil may come near us. May Your peace be our refuge in times of trouble, knowing that You are our ultimate protector" (*Psalms 91:11-12; Proverbs 18:10*).
- 24. Guidance in Relationships:** "Heavenly Father, we seek Your guidance and wisdom for our relationships. Help us to love one another selflessly and unconditionally. Teach us to communicate with kindness and understanding, resolving conflicts peacefully. Guide us in choosing healthy friendships and relationships that honor You. May our relationships reflect Your love and grace" (*Proverbs 13:20; 1 Corinthians 13:4-7*).
- 25. Gratitude and Thankfulness:** "Gracious God, we come before You with hearts full of gratitude and thankfulness. Thank You for Your love, mercy, and faithfulness that never fail. Thank You for the big and small blessings You have bestowed upon us. Help us to cultivate a heart of gratitude in all circumstances, knowing that You work all things together for our good. May our lives be a testimony of gratitude and praise to You" (*Psalms 107:1; 1 Thessalonians 5:18*).
- 26. Patience and Endurance:** "Merciful Father, we ask for Your patience and endurance in times of waiting and trials. Help us to trust in Your perfect timing and plan, even when it seems difficult. Grant us the strength to persevere through challenges and to remain steadfast in our faith. Teach us to rely on Your grace and to find our rest in You. May our patience and endurance bring glory to Your name" (*James 1:3-4; Galatians 6:9*).
- 27. Contentment and Satisfaction:** "Loving God, we pray for the ability to find contentment and satisfaction in You alone. Please help us to resist the temptations of materialism and comparison. Show us that true joy and fulfillment come from a relationship with You. Grant us a heart that is content with what we have and a spirit that is satisfied in Your presence. May we find our ultimate satisfaction in You, our loving Creator" (*Philippians 4:11-13; Psalms 16:11*).
- 28. Boldness in Sharing the Gospel:** "Gracious Lord, we ask for boldness and courage in sharing the good news of Jesus Christ with others. Remove our fears and insecurities, and fill us with Your Holy Spirit. Help us to proclaim Your love and salvation to those around us boldly. Open doors for us to share the truth and grant us wisdom to speak with grace and conviction. May Your name be known and glorified through our witness" (*Acts 4:29; Matthew 28:19-20*).
- 29. Humility and Servanthood:** "Heavenly Father, we pray for humility and a servant's heart. Help us to put others before ourselves, just as Jesus did. Teach us to serve one another with love and compassion. Remove any pride or selfishness that may hinder our relationships.

May we be willing to humble ourselves and serve those in need, reflecting Your character to the world. May our actions speak louder than words, showing Your love to all" (*Philippians 2:3-4; Mark 10:45*).

- 30. Guidance in Career and Finances:** "Wise God, we seek Your guidance in our careers and finances. Direct our steps and open doors for us to use our skills and abilities for Your glory. Grant us wisdom in managing our finances and making wise decisions. Help us be good stewards of the resources You entrusted us. May our work and financial endeavors honor You and bless others" (*Proverbs 3:9-10; Colossians 3:23*).
- 31. Protection of Family and Loved Ones:** "Faithful God, we bring our families and loved ones before You, asking for Your protection and provision. Guard them from harm and keep them safe from all dangers, seen and unseen. Strengthen the bonds of love and unity within our families. Grant us wisdom in parenting and relationships" (*Psalms 91:11-12; Proverbs 3:5-6*).
- 32. Wisdom in Decision-Making:** "God of wisdom, we seek Your guidance and direction in making important decisions. Grant us discernment to make choices that align with Your will and purpose for our lives. Help us seek Your wisdom above our understanding, knowing that You have the best plans for us. Fill us with Your Holy Spirit, that we may make decisions that honor and glorify You in all areas of our lives" (*Proverbs 3:5-6, James 1:5*).
- 33. Forgiveness and Reconciliation:** "Loving Father, we come before You with hearts that desire forgiveness and reconciliation. Help us to forgive others as You have forgiven us. Remove any bitterness, anger, or resentment from our hearts. Teach us to seek reconciliation and restoration in our relationships, following the example of Jesus Christ. May our lives testify to Your grace and forgiveness to those around us" (*Ephesians 4:32; Colossians 3:13*).
- 34. Strength and Courage in Difficult Times:** "Almighty God, we ask for Your strength and courage to face the challenges and trials that come our way. When we feel weak and overwhelmed, remind us that You are our refuge and strength. Help us to trust in Your promises and to find our strength in You. Grant us the courage to persevere and to walk in faith, knowing that You are with us every step of the way" (*Psalms 46:1-2; Isaiah 41:10*).
- 35. Unity and Harmony in the Church:** "Heavenly Father, we pray for unity and harmony in Your Church. Remove any divisions or conflicts that hinder the work of Your Kingdom. Help us to love one another and to bear with one another in humility and grace. Teach us to value and appreciate the diversity within Your Body so that we may be a shining example of Your love and unity to the world. May we work together in harmony, spreading Your Gospel and making disciples" (*Romans 12:16; Ephesians 4:3*).
- 36. Comfort for the Grieving:** "Compassionate God, we lift up those grieving the loss of a loved one. Comfort them in their pain and bring them peace that surpasses all understanding. Surround them with Your love and presence, reminding them that You are close to the brokenhearted. Give them strength to face each day and hope for the future. May they find solace in Your promises and the assurance of eternal life in Christ Jesus" (*Matthew 5:4; Psalm 34:18*).
- 37. Protection and Provision for the Poor and Needy:** "Merciful Father, we pray for the protection and provision of the poor and needy. Open our eyes to see their needs and give us compassionate hearts to respond. Help us to be generous and willing to share what we have, for everything we have comes from You. Provide for the physical, emotional, and spiritual needs of the less fortunate. May we be Your hands and feet, bringing hope and practical help to those in need" (*Proverbs 19:17; James 2:15-16*).
- 38. Transformation and Renewal:** "Gracious God, we long for transformation and renewal in our lives. Create in us clean hearts and renew a right spirit within us.

Help us to put off our old selves and put on the new self that is found in Christ Jesus. Transform our minds and attitudes, molding us to be more like You. Empower us by Your Spirit to live lives that bring glory and honor to Your name" (*Psalms 51:10; Romans 12:2*).

- 39. Protection from Temptation and Sin:** "Faithful Lord, we ask for Your protection from temptation and sin. Please help us resist the enemy's schemes and flee from our flesh's desires. Give us discernment to recognize the lies and deceptions that lead us astray. Strengthen us to stand firm in our faith and to walk in righteousness. Fill us with Your Spirit, that we may have victory over sin and live lives that please You" (*1 Corinthians 10:13; Galatians 5:16*).
- 40. Revival and Spiritual Awakening:** "Mighty God, we cry out for revival and spiritual awakening in our lives, communities, and nations. Pour out Your Spirit upon us, drawing us closer to You. Ignite a passion for Your Word and a hunger for Your presence. Bring conviction of sin and a deep desire for repentance. May Your Church rise up in power and unity, proclaiming the Gospel and making disciples. Let Your Kingdom come and Your will be done on Earth as it is in Heaven" (*Psalms 85:6; 2 Chronicles 7:14*).
- 41. Healing for the Sick:** "Compassionate Healer, we bring all those suffering from illness and disease before You. Touch them with Your healing hand and bring restoration to their bodies. Grant wisdom to medical professionals and provide them with the knowledge and resources needed to bring healing. Comfort and strengthen those who are struggling with pain and uncertainty. May Your healing power be evident in their lives, bringing glory to Your name" (*Psalms 103:2-3; James 5:14-15*).
- 42. Guidance for Leaders:** "Wise and Sovereign God, we pray for guidance and wisdom for our leaders. Whether in positions of authority in government, business, or any other area, may they seek Your direction in making decisions that impact many. Grant them discernment and an understanding heart to lead with integrity and justice. Surround them with wise counsel and give them the courage to stand for righteousness. May they use their positions of influence to bring about positive change and serve the common good" (*Proverbs 11:14; James 1:5*).
- 43. Protection for the Persecuted:** "Loving Father, we lift up our brothers and sisters facing persecution for their faith. Strengthen them in their trials and grant them the courage to stand firm. Please give them wisdom to navigate difficult situations and protect them from harm. Surround them with Your peace and comfort. Let Your justice prevail and shine a light on the darkness that seeks to silence them. Help us to remember and support them in prayer and action" (*Matthew 5:10-12; Hebrews 13:3*).
- 44. Faithfulness in Stewardship:** "Gracious God, we acknowledge that all we have is a gift from You. Teach us to be faithful stewards of the resources, time, and talents You have entrusted to us. Help us to use them wisely and for Your glory. Grant us a generous spirit that we may give cheerfully and sacrificially. May we prioritize Your Kingdom and seek Your righteousness first in every area of our lives. Show us opportunities to make a difference in the lives of others through our stewardship" (*Matthew 25:21; 2 Corinthians 9:7*).
- 45. Hope for the Hopeless:** "God of hope, we pray for those who have lost hope and are struggling with despair. Bring light into their darkness and show them there is always hope in You. Comfort them in their pain and fill them with Your peace. Use us as instruments of hope so we may share Your love and encourage those who need it most. Help us point them to the ultimate hope in Jesus Christ, who conquered sin and death" (*Romans 15:13; Psalms 34:17-18*).
- 46. Humility and Servanthood:** "Humble Savior, teach us the value of humility and servanthood. Help us to set aside our pride and selfish ambitions and to follow Your example of humility. Enable us to serve others with love and compassion, putting their needs before our own.

Give us a heart that is willing to do the lowly tasks and love even those who are difficult to love. May our lives reflect Your servant heart, drawing others to You through our actions” (*Philippians 2:3-5; Mark 10:45*).

- 47. Guidance for Relationships:** "Loving God, we seek Your guidance and wisdom in our relationships. Help us to love one another as You have loved us. Grant us patience, kindness, and understanding in our interactions. Teach us to forgive and seek reconciliation when conflicts arise. May our relationships be built on a foundation of trust and mutual respect. Strengthen our bonds and help us to grow together in love and unity” (*1 Corinthians 13:4-7; Colossians 3:13-14*).
- 48. Gratitude and Contentment:** "Gracious Provider, we thank You for the abundant blessings You have bestowed upon us. Teach us to cultivate an attitude of gratitude and contentment. Help us to appreciate the simple joys and blessings in our lives rather than constantly striving for more. Remind us that true contentment is found in You alone. Guard our hearts from envy and greed, and fill us with a spirit of thankfulness for all You have given us” (*1 Thessalonians 5:18; Philippians 4:11-12*).
- 49. Guidance in Parenting:** "Heavenly Father, we pray for Your wisdom and guidance in our roles as parents. Give us the patience, love, and understanding needed to raise our children in a way that honors You. Help us to model Christ-like behavior and to teach them Your ways. Give us discernment to make decisions that are in their best interest. Surround our children with Your protection and draw them close to You. May our parenting reflect Your love and grace, and may our children grow up to know and love You. We rely on Your strength and wisdom as we navigate the challenges and joys of parenting. Thank You for the precious gift of our children. In Jesus' name, amen” (*Proverbs 22:6; Ephesians 6:4*).
- 50. Revival:** "Heavenly Father, we cry out for revival in our hearts, churches, and communities. Ignite a fire within us, Lord, that cannot be quenched. Stir up a hunger and thirst for You, and let Your Spirit move mightily among us. Break down the barriers that hinder revival and bring unity among Your people. May we experience a fresh outpouring of Your presence and power, leading to transformed lives and a renewed passion for sharing the Gospel. Revive us, O Lord, and let Your Kingdom come” (*Psalms 85:6; Acts 2:1-4*).
- 51. Seeing Jesus Face to Face:** "Oh, glorious day, when we shall see Jesus face to face! Lord, we eagerly anticipate that moment when we will behold Your beauty and be in Your presence for eternity. Prepare our hearts for that day so that we may live in joyful expectation and faithful obedience. Help us to fix our eyes on You, Jesus, and to live with an eternal perspective. Thank You for the promise of eternal life and the hope of being with You forever” (*1 Corinthians 13:12; Revelation 22:4*).
- 52. Fresh Revelation:** "Almighty God, we hunger and thirst for fresh revelation from You. Open our eyes, ears, and hearts to receive Your Word and truth. Speak to us through Your Holy Spirit, illuminating the Scriptures and revealing Your will for our lives. Help us to approach Your Word with humility and a teachable spirit, ready to receive new understanding and insight. May Your truth transform us and equip us to live as Your ambassadors in this world” (*Psalms 119:18; John 16:13*).
- 53. Renewed Passion for Worship:** "Glorious God, renew our passion for worshiping You. Stir up a deep desire within us to praise and adore Your holy name. Open our hearts to experience Your presence in a fresh and powerful way. Help us worship You in spirit and truth, offering our whole selves as living sacrifices. Remove any distractions or hindrances that keep us from fully engaging in worship. May our worship be genuine, heartfelt, and pleasing to You” (*Psalms 95:1-2; John 4:24*).
- 54. Hunger for God's Word:** "Heavenly Father, ignite within us a hunger and thirst for Your Word. Help us approach the Scriptures with a longing to know You more intimately. Give us a love for studying and meditating on Your Word so that it may become a lamp to our feet and a light to our path.

Grant us wisdom and discernment as we seek to understand and apply Your truth. May Your Word be a source of comfort, guidance, and transformation in our lives" (*Psalm 119:105; 2 Timothy 3:16-17*).

- 55. Anointing for Kingdom Impact:** "Mighty God, we pray for a fresh anointing of Your Holy Spirit upon us. Empower us to be bold witnesses for Jesus Christ and to make a significant impact in the world around us. Fill us with Your love, compassion, and power so that we may bring healing, deliverance, and salvation to those who are lost and hurting. Use us as vessels of Your grace and instruments of Your Kingdom, for Your glory and the expansion of Your reign on Earth" (*Acts 1:8; Isaiah 61:1*).
- 56. Deeper Intimacy with God:** "Loving Father, draw us into a deeper intimacy with You. Help us to cultivate a vibrant and personal relationship with You, marked by love, trust, and obedience. Remove anything that hinders our connection with You and fill us with a hunger for more of You. Teach us to abide in You, that Your joy may be in us and our joy may be complete. May our lives constantly reflect Your love and grace" (*John 15:5; James 4:8*).
- 57. Greater Compassion for the Lost:** "Compassionate Savior, break our hearts for what breaks Yours. Please give us greater compassion for the lost and the hurting. Help us to see people through Your eyes and to love them unconditionally. Stir within us a burden for those who do not know You, that we may boldly share the Gospel and lead them to salvation. Use us as instruments of Your grace and mercy, that many may come to know You and experience Your love" (*Matthew 9:36; Romans 10:14-15*).
- 58. Spiritual Awakening:** "God of power and revival, we cry out for a spiritual awakening in our land. Break through the spiritual darkness and complacency that surrounds us. Pour out Your Spirit on all flesh and draw people to repentance and faith in Jesus Christ. Bring conviction of sin and a hunger for righteousness. May Your Church rise up in unity and boldness" (*2 Chronicles 7:14; Joel 2:28*).
- 59. Apostolic Center Will Be Established:** "Dear Lord, we align ourselves with Your vision for the apostolic center so that Your people will become the army of believers You are equipping and raising up to do the work of the ministry. We pray for signs, wonders, and miracles in the lives of Your people. We call in souls from the north, south, east, and west, in Jesus' name." (*Ephesians 4:12; Hebrews 2:4; Luke 13:29*).
- 60. Every Believer Finds Their Place of Ministry:** "Heavenly Father, guide and direct every believer to find their place within the apostolic center" (*1 Corinthians 12:27; Romans 12:4-5*).

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
